On behalf of our activist community, I urge you to contact your representative and senators and them to support the Stop Questionable, Unnecessary, and Excessive Allowances for Legislators (SQUEAL) Act to cut perks for elected officials. This is a bicameral effort led by Rep. David Schweikert (R-Ariz.), sponsor of H.R. 4217, and Sen. Joni Ernst (R-Iowa), sponsor of S. 2033.

Millions of everyday taxpayers are allowed to deduct unreimbursed travel expenses from their income taxes at the end of the year. This includes lodging, food, and certain other costs incurred while away from home. This provides some relief for hardworking families across the country come tax time.

Federal legislators, however, take advantage of this portion of the tax code to create an excessive loophole for themselves, punishing taxpayers across the country. For tax purposes, legislators define their home as their district. This means they can deduct ordinary expenses in Washington as a travel expense, despite the fact that they live and work months out of the year there.
