- Salmon Amendment – To allow parents to opt their children out of standardized tests, without the schools being punished for lack of participation.
- Zeldin Amendment – To allow states to opt out of Common Core or any other standards without being punished by the Education Secretary in any way, including through the use of grants or waivers.

These amendments greatly strengthen the education bill by increasing state and local autonomy and individual choice in education.
